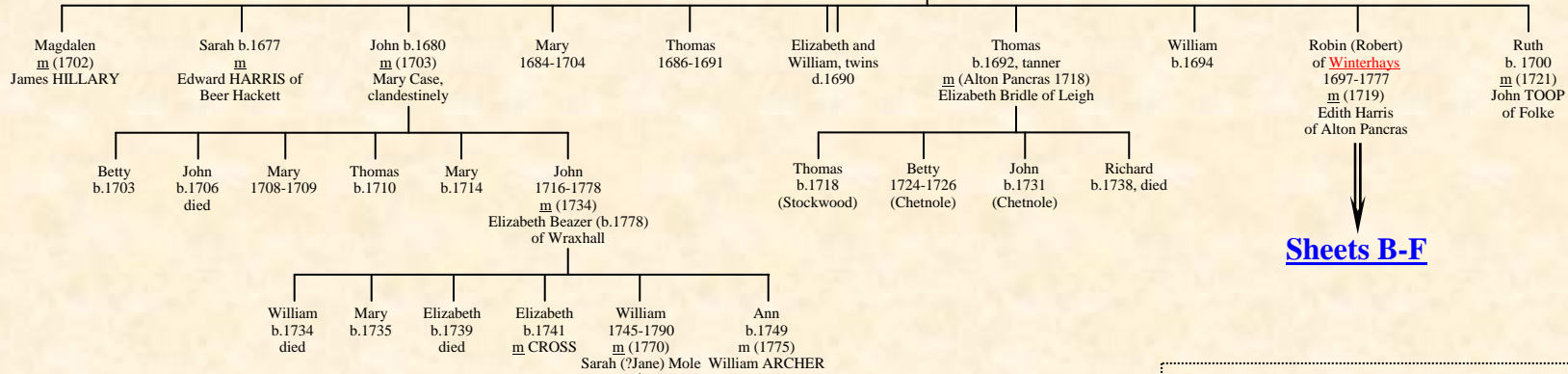

farmer of Leigh, Yetminster

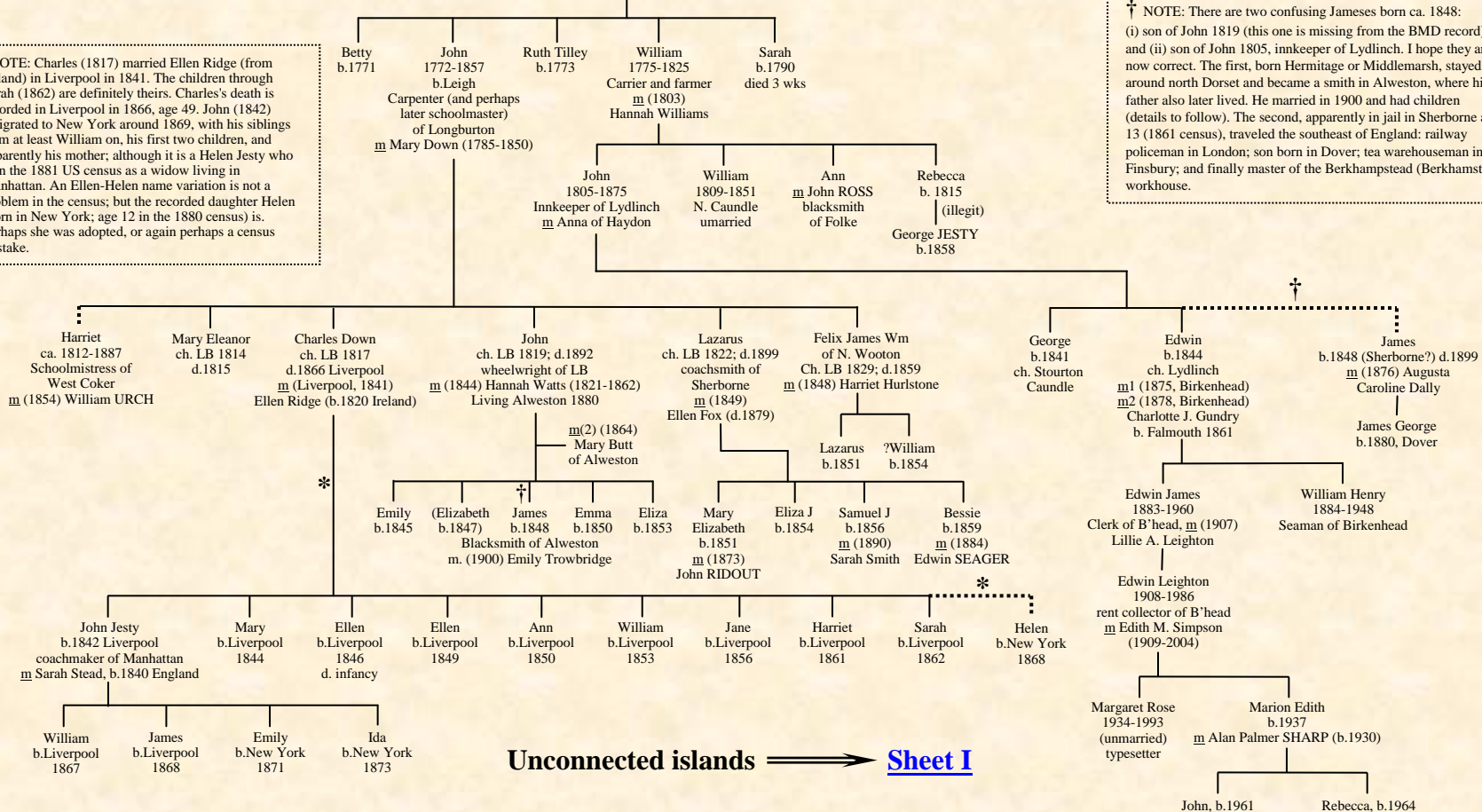

*NOTE: Charles (1817) married Ellen Ridge (from Ireland) in Liverpool in 1841. The children through Sarah (1862) are definitely theirs. Charles's death is recorded in Liverpool in 1866, age 49. John (1842) emigrated to New York around 1869, with his siblings from at least William on, his first two children, and apparently his mother; although it is a Helen Jesty who is in the 1881 US census as a widow living in Manhattan. An Ellen-Helen name variation is not a problem in the census; but the recorded daughter Helen (born in New York; age 12 in the 1880 census) is. Perhaps she was adopted, or again perhaps a census mistake.

† NOTE: There are two confusing Jameses born ca. 1848: (i) son of John 1819 (this one is missing from the BMD record), and (ii) son of John 1805, innkeeper of Lydlinch. I hope they are now correct. The first, born Hermitage or Middlemarsh, stayed around north Dorset and became a smith in Alwinston, where his father also later lived. He married in 1900 and had children (details to follow). The second, apparently in jail in Sherborne at 13 (1861 census), traveled the southeast of England: railway policeman in London; son born in Dover; tea warehouseman in Finsbury; and finally master of the Berkhamstead (Berkhamsted) workhouse.
